Over the past two years, NHS England has learned of widespread issues with the treatment received by trans-gender and non-binary people, which includes reports of discrimination in the NHS and reduced access to health services. There has been a public commitment made by the board of NHS England to address the problems experienced by the trans-gender and non-binary community with an understanding that, due to the complexity of the issues, involvement from other organisations will be required to make impactful changes and improve the experience and outcomes of trans and non binary people. A number of statutory organisations and various professional associations have been invited to this Symposium with the intention to support each other in discharging our ethical and legal responsibilities towards trans and non-binary people by agreeing a collective ambition for addressing the problem, by defining where responsibility for each element of the problem sits across organisations and what action can be taken to make progress.
